Looking back over some of the reports of what God is doing is such an encouragement to us when we are tired and wonder why we're still doing this. One lady wrote us this letter of how Lloyd's message impacted her life. Here is some of what she said to us:

A little background...I remember you speaking about how the chains of shame came off your life when you confessed your addiction (to your in-laws I believe?). For some reason, God really impressed that upon my heart, though at the time, I didn't understand why. I do now though!

Four days before last Christmas, my husband totally floored me with the announcement that he wanted a divorce. Our marriage was far from perfect, but I didn't realize how awful it had become. The bottom line is, we were both at fault, but I felt the brunt of the blame AND the shame.

Early in the process, God reminded me of your testimony. He told me I too would be confessing my sins as an ungodly wife, but I would be doing it in front of the church body.

One Sunday as pastor was preparing to begin the sermon, he asked for a testimony. Boy, did my heart start POUNDING as the Holy Spirit said "today's the day for your confession." I almost sprinted to the front of the church! (I

knew God wanted this to be heard, so I used the mike). I confessed how I had treated my husband over the years, about my meanness and hatefulness, and how I had pushed him away so hard until he walked away from me. It was a very tearful confession, but I wasn't the only one shedding tears...several in the congregation were also weeping with me. I ended by asking the congregation for forgiveness for being such a weak member of the body. It was a moment I will never forget.

God is so good and so faithful. He has done amazing work in my life and brought me to a new place in Him.

Thank you for being faithful in sharing your testimony. I'm sure you are aware you are making a difference in people's lives...I just wanted you to hear my testimony to encourage you to continue on in God's work!
